| <b>Risk Statement</b>                                      | <p>The Russian Orthodox Church Outside of Russia (ROCOR), Parish: Kazan Icon of the Mother of God, Cardiff is a voluntary organization. All people who come to the services do this voluntarily and at their own choice and risk. As grown up and capable members of society, they make their own risk assessments every day, such as e.g. driving a car, which is by far a much more hazardous activity. Also, being members of the society, they are already informed by the Mass Media about COVID-19 and associated risks and come to the Church because this is what they choose to do. However, we are not leaving this to chance and there is a process in place when those who wish to attend the service, participate in confession or receive Holy Communion, do this strictly through the Clergy – all visits are allowed on a pre-booking basis only, this also allows the clergy team to give the parishioners personalized instructions, such as – take additional precautions if you belong to a vulnerable group, such as old age, chronic diseases (heart condition, kidney problems, lung problems etc.) and to remind of COVID -19 social distancing requirements. Parents/guardians of children under 16 years of age need to review, understand and accept the risks on behalf of their children if they are to attend public services.</p> |                        |   |                       |  |

| <b>Senior and Vulnerable Persons</b>                       | As based on this Risk Assessment and information provided by the referenced sources, though the likelihood for the Senior and Vulnerable People is low, the outcome can still be fatal, no matter what measures are in place. They will be recommended to refrain from visiting unless the HSE and Government advice change/new scientific evidence reveals it is safe to do so. However, as this is a voluntary organization, it is the responsibility of the individual to identify if he/she considers themselves vulnerable or not. It should also be taken into consideration, that people may have a different scale of values and priorities, and may consider a visit to Church as a crucial and indispensable part of their life, for example more important than a visit to a supermarket.   |                        |   |                       |  |

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| <b>Hand Sanitiser/Washing</b> | Clergy, stewards, worshipers | Hand sanitiser is provided at both the entry and exit to the church. | <b>Social Distancing</b>      | Clergy, stewards, worshipers | <p><b>General:</b> Parishioners within the church, or anywhere on the grounds, must maintain social distancing, ideally of 2 metres between persons, but, as per Government regulations, more than 1 metre apart with extra precautions (such as face masks) in place.</p> <p>Clergy and Altar Servers within the Holy Altar shall observe the same social distancing rules, except in extraordinary circumstances where this is not possible.</p> <p>Notices concerning Social Distancing will be placed in church, and instructions in this regard will be announced from the Amvon by the parish clergy.</p> <p>A 'one way' system in the church shall also be maintained when possible.</p> <p><b>Limitation of numbers:</b> In order to make possible the necessary social distancing outlined above, numbers of Faithful permitted into the church for the divine services will be strictly limited. | <b>Musical Provision</b> | Clergy, Choir | <p>Chanting and liturgical musical provision is an essential part of Orthodox worship. Following the latest Government guidance (11th January 2021), the total number of singers permitted in the choir shall be 3.</p> <p>Chanters / singers are not required to wear face coverings whilst performing their liturgical duties; however, they are required to wear face coverings at all other times when in the church.</p> <p>Singers shall maintain the largest degree of social distancing permitted by the space available, and shall take attention to position themselves so that they are not directly facing each other. The choir should be facing East (i.e. away from the people).</p>   | <p>No shared music or variables will be used by members of the choir. ### Guidance for Public Services

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| <b>The Liturgical Space</b>             | Although public worship is now possible with social distancing measures in place, we have yet to return to the celebration of public liturgies in the University Church as it remains closed until further notice due to it being part of a residential care home. We have permission to temporarily use St. John the Evangelist, St. John's Crescent, Canton to perform services. The above risk assessment has been based on this and will be reviewed if their risk assessment changes or new government laws are introduced. |
| <b>Iconostasis/Icons for Veneration</b> | The 2 icons at the front of the altar represent the iconostasis and should <b>not</b> be venerated by the faithful. Icons on an iconostasis are only to be venerated by the clergy. Icons will be placed at the entrance to the Church and a dedicated hygiene warden will ensure that after each individual/family group has venerated the icon it will be cleaned with an Anti-bacterial wipe before it is venerated by the next individual/family group.  |

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| <b>Altar/Ambvon</b>             | Liturgical areas should be kept clear so as to allow the clergy to celebrate the services. We are not in a dedicated Orthodox liturgical space so it is easy to forget where we are in the church. Nobody apart from the clergy and those blessed to serve should be in the altar, additionally the only time the faithful should be in the area reserved for the ambvon is to receive Holy Communion.   |
| <b>Capacity</b>                 | <p>Seats are arranged individually at 2 metre distance. Seating for couples and families have also been provided.</p> <p>All worshipers must 'pre book' a space in advance of the service so that the clergy team can ensure that the areas do not become overloaded and safe distancing is maintained. Priority will be given to those who wish to confess and if blessed receive Holy Communion that week. If there is no space available on a specific week please do not get upset as the clergy team will ensure you get scheduled as a priority onto a future date.</p>  |
| <b>Pre-booking</b>              | <b>Please do not just turn up</b> - all public services until further notice will need to be booked in advance, this allows the clergy team to ensure we do not exceed the safe distancing regulations. Additionally by doing this you agree that your information will be securely held on a register for 21 days to ensure the government track and trace system can be supported should we be informed of anyone experiencing symptoms, after this time the paper register will be destroyed.   |
| <b>Face coverings (Masks)</b>   | The legal position on wearing face coverings in a public indoor space in Wales has changed (14/09/2020) - <i>Worshipers aged 11 and over must wear a face covering unless they have a reasonable excuse not to wear one as described in the government documentation.</i> Face coverings must cover both the nose and mouth, therefore the plastic 'face shields' are not considered a face covering/mask. Please refer to this link for additional information ( <a href="https://gov.wales/face-coverings-guidance-public">https://gov.wales/face-coverings-guidance-public</a> ) which will detail the specific rules and exemptions which could apply to you. Single use masks will be provided for any worshipers who do not have one and should be wearing one, however please try to bring your own so that the parish does not incur significant additional costs in supplying them each visit.  |
| <b>Divine Liturgy</b>           | The Divine Liturgy will be served in its normal format without change – although there will be a limited choir given space and safety considerations. <i>Worshipers aged 11+ must wear a suitable face covering unless they have a reasonable excuse not to wear one as per the government documentation</i> ( <a href="https://gov.wales/face-coverings-guidance-public">https://gov.wales/face-coverings-guidance-public</a> ). Worshipers will be asked to arrive in time for the beginning of Liturgy as this will minimise disruption in ensuring people are positioned in their allocated space. Socialising should not take place in the worship area as the space is very small and noise is distracting from prayer, we have all missed each other's company but please ensure this is done outside at a safe distance. If you are unable to attend, please contact Deacon Mark as soon as you become aware so that your space can be reassigned to someone else. |
| <b>Receiving Holy Communion</b> | Holy Communion will be administered by the celebrant priest. Please follow the instructions of the clergy when approaching individually to receive Communion. Masks must be fully removed prior to approaching to receive Holy Communion. Clean disposable cups will be provided to each individual/couple/family to consume zapifka, cups should be placed into the bin once used. You should prepare to receive Communion in the normal way; Please do not approach the chalice if you have not received the prior blessing to do so.  |
| <b>Vespers</b>                  | Vespers will not be able to be celebrated as we only have access to the church on a Sunday morning.  |
| <b>Hand Gel/Candles</b>         | As noted in the risk assessment above please be aware that if you have applied hand sanitiser gel and it has not been sufficiently rubbed into your hands so that there is no excess remaining you should not light a candle. Excess alcohol gel on your hands could act as an accelerant and ignite if  |

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|                                      | close to a flame. Parents should ensure that they supervise the use of hand gel with their children and before candles are lit perform a check to ensure the hands are free from any excess gel.   |
| <b>Cleaning volunteers</b>           | It is essential if we wish to celebrate services that we minimise our impact and potential infection to the residents. Volunteers are required to help clean the church hall and shared toilet after each service. Please indicate when pre booking your space for a service if you are able to volunteer for the cleaning party. If we are unable to ensure we have sufficient cleaning volunteers this will impact on our ability to provide public services and we will need to reduce the number of spaces available for public attendance whilst increasing the number of spaces for dedicated hygiene wardens. Cleaning products will be provided all we need is your time and goodwill. Cleaning volunteers will be agreed before each service so that we know it can proceed and be cleaned successfully afterwards. |
| <b>Trapeza (Shared Meal)</b>         | Unfortunately, at this time regulations direct we are unable to share a meal together following services. We will keep this under review and advise of any changes as they occur.  |
| <b>Baptisms/Weddings</b>             | Baptisms and weddings will be reviewed on an individual basis and instructions issued after receiving a blessing to proceed from Bishop Irenei.  |
| <b>Toilet Facilities</b>             | There is a single shared toilet, this should be cleaned with the provided cleaning products after each use so as to ensure that the surfaces are clean for the next user.  |
| <b>Symptoms/Positive test result</b> | <p>If you have any symptoms, please do not come to a public service and follow government/NHS advice to self isolate until you receive confirmation through a recognised test that you do not have Covid-19.</p> <p>If you have recently been to a service at church and have tested positive for Covid-19 please ensure that both yourself and the NHS test and trace service contact Deacon Mark (07790 031375) who has the copy of the attendance register.</p> <p>If you need to self isolate and need assistance or help please contact Deacon Mark so that as a parish we are able to help you and your family.</p>  |
